


Wisconsin's Premiere Travel Baseball Program



ABOUT US

The Midwest Halos was founded in 2019 by Cody Smith and Trevor Theissen. Halos is an elite travel program that focuses on development and exposure for ages 13U-18U with the premier coaching staff in the state. The Halos and Cody have had over 100+ athletes playing college and pro ball including (Alec Marsh - Arizona State/Kansas City Royals, Eric Torres - Kansas State/Los Angeles Angels, Luke Sommerfeld - Clemson/Detroit Tigers, Griffin Doersching - Oklahoma State/San Diego Padres, Max Alba - Liberty/Detroit Tigers, Presley Wachowiak - University of Illinois-Chicago, Willard Peterson - Evansville, AJ Lausten - St. Johns, Vidal Colon - University of Illinois-Chicago, Augie Mihlbauer -TCU). Our teams play in high level national events with the focus of exposure to college coaches around the country against the best competition.




















HALOS FACILITIES

All teams practice at one of our two our Indoor Facilities - The Halo Muskego or Halos North. The Halo is open year round to all Halo players, where they have the ability to come in individually to reserve cage time and get extra work in at no extra charge. Halos Muskego includes:

- 36,000 total sq. ft. including a 6,000 sq. ft. weight room
- Full infield, 8 cages, 160 ft. long toss/velocity tunnel
- The station of the st

FALL BASEBALL

Midwest Halos Fall Baseball is an extension of our summer travel program focusing on development and exposure, where teams are broken up by Grad Class. Fall is an added cost, team practices will start late August and tournament season runs until beginning/mid October. The 13/14U will play in a Sunday Fall League with 1-2 tournaments and the 15U+ will play 4-5 tournaments where 2-3 are travel events (Illinois, Iowa, Indiana and possibly Florida).


WINTER TRAINING

Team Practices and Position Specific Training both start the week of November 1st. Team Practices will be held on Saturdays for three hours, which includes two hours on the turf and one hour in the gym for team lift. Team Practices will run up until the beginning of March, which is when High School Spring reports for 15U+ teams. The 13/14U's will move to twice a week practices once Spring High School ball starts up until league/tournament play begins.

Position Specific Training are focused 16-week classes led by our elite high level coaching staff that are skill focused (Catching, Pitching, Infield, Hitting, and Velocity). These classes are broken into two divisions - Intermediate and Advanced. Both divisions cover similar areas with Advanced moving faster focusing more on reps vs fundamentals/mechanics.







WINTER TRAINING (CONT.)

- Infield: Trevor Theissen (North Carolina Central) will lead again this year, he will continue his efforts in turning out the highest level of Infielders in the state. This class will show our INF everyday work, footwork, proper fielding mechanics, throwing slots, glove work, and baseball IQ. Along with these two we will again be joined by Luke Maldonado (Winthrop University) and Riley Garczynski (Indiana University-Kokomo).
- Catching: Catching will be led by Ryan Kalinowski (Bryant & Stratton) and the focus for the winter will be; receiving, blocking, and throwing. Ryan has already impressed us and we are excited to see him take the catching side of Halos to a new level. He will touch on primary/secondary position, mental side of calling a game, bunt coverages, footwork, back picks and more.
- Pitching: Pitching will focus on everything from cleaning up players mechanics, velocity utilizing mobility/plyos/weighted balls, pitch grip, holding runners on, pickoffs, mental side, PFP's, warm up routines, post game routines, and more. Ran by Cody Smith, but will also feature Ty Ramirez (Creighton University), Nolan Peterson (Jacksonville University), and Ty Peccioli (Schaumburg Boomers).
- Hitting: Dominic Clementi (University of Michigan) is our Hitting Director. Hitting will always have a major focus on mechanics and will instruct our players on philosophy and approach, hitting velocity, off-speed and the mental side. Class will include Griffin Doersching (Oklahoma State/San Diego Padres) and Alex Tricoli-Walkanoff (Heartland CC).
- Velocity: Velocity will be led by Tyler Peccioli (Marian University/Schaumburg Boomers) who has designed this 16 week program to focus on adding MPH to both pitchers and position players. Players will focus on maximizing their kinetic chain, strength training, proper movement patters, mobility, utilizing ploy balls, med-balls and arm care recovery. This class will meet twice a week for the 16 weeks and all players will see a significant jump with velocity being the main goal.














HALOS COACHING STAFF

Cody Smith - Owner

Cody Smith attended Kettle Moraine High School from 2005 to 2008. He helped take Kettle Moraine to their first State Championship baseball game in 20 years. During his time at Kettle Moraine, Cody was named All-Lake County, All-Conference, All-State, and runner up to Player of The Year. After High School, he continued his playing career at Dominican University of New York, where he played from 2008 to 2012. Struggles with injuries throughout his college career led Smith to pursue his love of coaching and player development. He returned to Wisconsin in 2011 and joined the Wisconsin Wildcats staff. He coached several teams until starting PoundTown Baseball in 2013. PoundTown grew on the national stage with their U15-U17 teams, all nationally ranked, and committing 100% of his seniors to college programs. In 2015, Cody had an opportunity to partner and rebrand to Prospect Training Academy, moving to The Rock Sports Complex where he owned and ran PTA until 2017. In 2019, Cody and Trevor co-founded the Midwest Halos with the primary goal of training and developing players and turning the Halos into a national powerhouse. Cody has committed over 100 players to college baseball programs such as Arizona State, Oklahoma State, Texas Christian, Louisville, University of North Carolina, University of Missouri, University of Evansville, University of Illinois, Chicago, University of Michigan, and many more.

Trevor Theissen is one of the co-founders of the Midwest Halos Program. Prior to the Halos, he coached in the area at other local travel ball programs as well in the High School circuit as an Assistant Varsity coach at New Berlin Eisenhower and West Allis Hale. Coach Theissen attended Franklin High school from 2008-2011. He helped lead the Sabers to back to back State Championships in 2010 and 2011 and was named first-team all-state, all-district, all-area, and all-conference in 2011. After high school, he spent his first two college seasons playing at UW-Milwaukee (D1), while redshirting his freshman year. Coach Theissen spent his redshirt sophomore season at College of Lake County Junior College where he hit .300 over 44 starts that included 10 doubles, 22 runs, and 10 stolen bases. That same season, Theissen also received a Rawlings Gold Glove award, given to some of the premier defenders across the country. He spent his final two college seasons at North Carolina Central University (D1). In 2015, he started in 48 games, where he hit .250 with 10 doubles. In his senior season in 2016, he started in 47 games, where he hit .300 with 27 RBI's, 13 doubles, 3 triples, 2 home runs, and was named Second Team All-Conference. Coach Theissen specializes in his work with our infielders as well as working with our hitters.














HALOS COACHING STAFF (CONT.)

Dominic Clementi - General Manager/Co-Owner

Clementi comes to the Midwest Halos eager to make an immediate impact within our organization. His duties will include player development and overall operations management. Clementi, an Arrowhead High School graduate, played at the University of Michigan, where he was a College World Series finalist. In 2018, Clementi was awarded the Bill Freehan Offensive Player of the Year after leading the Big Ten Conference in hitting. Off the field, Clementi was a representative for the Student-Athlete Academic Committee, amongst many other groups for which he was passionate about. After his playing career finished, Clementi earned positions on the coaching staff at Wayne State University, Creighton University, and the Michigan Monarchs, a team in the Great Lake Summer Collegiate Baseball League.

Tyler Peccioli - Pitching and Velocity Coordinator

From Gurnee, IL Tyler Peccioli attended Marian University from 2016-2019 and studied exercise science. In his Marian career, Peccioli pitched 39 times making 22 starts with nine wins, a save, and two complete games. He struck out a total of 144 hitters during his career, 10th on the all-time strikeout list, over 155.1innings for an 8.34 strikeouts per nine innings rate. Peccioli dominated his senior season starting in nine games with a 2.92 earned-run average over 61.2innings of work. He struck out 66 hitters, tied for the seventh-most in a single season in Marian baseball history, for a 9.63 strikeouts per nine innings average. Tyler, participated in the Northwoods league and Prospect league during college and was a Prospect league All-star in 2019. After college, he signed a professional contract in the Frontier League with the Schaumburg Boomers.

Connor Kimple - Midwest Halos North Director

We're excited to introduce Connor Kimple as our Director of Halos North. Kimple is a former player of Cody who just finished up a six-year collegiate baseball career. Connor walked on at Oklahoma State and then after red-shirting his first season, he moved on to South Mountain Community College where he had a First-Team All-Conference and First-Team All-Region season which led to a scholarship offer from Louisiana University. Through COVID delays and injury rehabs, he was able to continue playing after both his NJCAA and NCAA experiences, spending three summers playing for the Lakeshore Chinooks in the Northwoods League.

Connor graduated from Marquette University High School in 2016, finishing his high school baseball career with multiple All-Conference, All-District and All-State Honors. We're excited to have Connor back and ready for him to get to work!

Josh Serio - Halos North Asst. Director & Pitching Coach Coach Serio and Division 1 collegiate athlete, hails from Greenfield, WI and most recently was an assistant coach at Whitnall High School. Before that, Sereo played at both UW-Milwaukee and UW-Parkside. He also played in the Northwoods League for three years and is a 2X Northwoods All-Star.

As a pitching coach, Serio's main focus is mechanics and arm care. Having a good mechanical foundation on the mound is the key to untapped potential at the travel ball level. We're excited to have him guiding our Halos North arms!
